First John 1:5-2:1

- 1) The standard—⁵ And this is [pres. act. ind. ϵἰμί] the message [ἀγγελία] (only other NT use is in 3:11; word group uses in 1:2-4) that we have heard [pf. act. ind. ἀκούω] (by revelation, not discovery) from Him (Jesus Christ) and are announcing [pres. act. ind. ἀναγγέλλω] to you^{pl},
 - a) Content—1:5b that [ὅτι] ...
 - i) Positively; His essence: God (the Father) is [pres. act. ind. $\epsilon \iota \mu \iota$] light [$\phi \hat{\omega} \varsigma$] (moral goodness, truth, righteousness and holiness) (cf. John 4:24; 8:12; 1st John 4:8, 16)
 - ii) Negatively: and in Him (the Father) is [pres. act. ind. ϵἰμί] no darkness [σκοτία], none at all.
 - b) Every true Christian will manifest some aspect of their Father's character.
- 2) Claim & correction # 1—1:6-7 [Characteristics of lifestyle]
 - a) Claim # 1—1:6 (denial of the sinfulness of sin; possibly unregenerate people)
 - i) Possibility (3rd class)—⁶ If [ἐάν] we should say [aor. act. subj. λέγω] that we are having [pres. act. ind. ἔχω] fellowship [κοινωνία] (emphatic) with Him (the Father), and in the darkness [σκότος] (emphatic) we are walking [pres. act. subj. περιπατέω], (cf. John 8:12; Ephesians 5:8)
 - ii) Reality—two-fold
 - (1) Positively—we are lying [pres. dep. ind. ψεύδομαι],
 - (2) Negatively—and we are not doing [pres. act. ind. ποιέω] the truth [ἀλήθεια] ... (i.e. not being obedient to God's Word; cf. John 3:21)
 - b) Correction # 1—1:7
 - i) Possibility (3rd class)—⁷ but if [ἐάν] in the light [φῶς] we keep on walking [pres. act. subj. περιπατέω]
 - (1) Who or what is the Standard?—as **He Himself** (emphatic) (the Father) is [pres. act. ind. $\epsilon i\mu i$] in the light [$\phi \hat{\omega} \varsigma$],
 - (2) However, our conformity to the Standard will always be imperfect.
 - ii) Reality—two-fold
 - (1) Horizontally—we are having [pres. act. ind. ἔχω] fellowship [κοινωνία] with one another, (fellowship is encouraged by right living)
 - (2) Vertically—and the blood [αἷμα] of Jesus Christ His Son is cleansing [pres. act. ind. καθαρίζω] us from each [πᾶς] sin [ἀμαρτία]. (comprehensive, spiritual cleansing from every kind of sin; no sin is beyond His power of cleansing; John 13:10)
- 3) Claim & correction # 2—1:8-9 [Relationship to sin]
 - a) Claim # 2—1:8 (denial of the reality of personal sin)
 - i) Possibility (3rd class)—8 If [ἐάν] we should say [aor. act. subj. λέγω] that we are not having [pres. act. ind. ἔχω] sin [ἀμαρτία], (denial of the awareness of one's guilt before God—John 9:41; 15:22, 24)
 - ii) Reality
 - (1) Positively—we are deceiving [pres. act. ind. πλανάω] ourselves
 - (2) Negatively—and the truth [ἀλήθεια] is [pres. act. ind. εἰμί] not in us. (cf. 1:6)
 - b) Correction # 2—1:9 (confession of sin, plus God the Father's character and conduct)

- i) Possibility—⁹ If [ἐάν] we are confessing [pres. act. subj. ὁμολογέω] our sins [άμαρτία], (cf. Psalm 51; Acts 19:18-20) (because the light exposes our guilt)
- ii) Reality—He (the Father) is faithful [πιστός] (reliable) and righteous [δίκαιος] (to condemn and forgive) in order that [ίνα] He (the Father)
 - (1) Debt canceled—should forgive [aor. act. subj. ἀφίημι] our sins [ὰμαρτία]
 - (2) Purity restored—and should cleanse [aor. act. subj. καθαρίζω] us from each (every kind of) [πᾶς] unrighteousness [ἀδικία].
- 4) Claim & correction # 3—1:10-2:1 [Recognizing the reality of our sin]
 - a) Claim # 3—1:10 (denial of the acts of sin; claim of sinless perfection)
 - i) Possibility (3rd class)—¹⁰ If [ἐάν] we should say [aor. act. subj. λέγω] that [ὅτι] we have not sinned [pf. act. ind. ἀμαρτάνω],
 - ii) Reality
 - (1) Positively—we are making [pres. act. ind. ποιέω] Him (the Father) a liar [ψεύστης]
 - (2) Negatively—and His Word [λόγος] is [pres. act. ind. ϵἰμί] not in us.(a) (cf. John 8:37)
 - b) Correction # 3—2:1b (the character of the Son, the unbroken relationship with the Father)
 - i) Possibility (3rd class)—... and if [ἐάν] someone should (commit an act of) sin [aor. act. subj. ἀμαρτάνω],
 - ii) Reality—we are having [pres. act. ind. ἔχω] an Advocate [παράκλητος] with [πρός] the Father, Jesus Christ the Righteous One [δίκαιος] (cf. Hebrews 7:25)
