Genesis 6:1-12 Introduction to the Flood

- 1) The end of the record of Adam—6:1-8 (end of 2nd toledoth that began in 5:1)
 - a) What people were seeing—6:1-4
 - i) Fulfilling the command and promise to increase—6:1 (cf. 1:22, 28; 3:16)
 - ii) Intermarriage between two distinct groups—6:2
 - (1) What happened? They saw good/beautiful women and married them
 - (2) Identifying the two groups
 - (a) Some see this as fallen angels intermarrying with human women
 - (b) Some see this as kings/nobles intermarrying with common people
 - (c) Some see this as Seth's godly line intermarrying with Cain's ungodly line
 - (d) Some see this as the normal intermarrying of men and women
 - iii) Yahweh responds with a warning—6:3
 - (1) Grant a period of time for repentance, i.e. 120 years until the Flood
 - (2) Begin to shorten the lifespan of mankind to 120 years maximum
 - iv) The celebrities of the day—6:4
 - (1) Society was aware of certain unique men—giants (LXX)/Nephilim (Hebrew)—cf. Numbers 13:30-33
 - (2) Children born to these marriages were well-known warriors
 - b) What Yahweh was seeing—6:5-8
 - i) Yahweh's response—6:5-7
 - (1) The Sovereign's *omniscience* demonstrated—6:5
 - External and internal sin, sinning exclusively and persistently
 - (2) The Creator's grief demonstrated—6:6 (cf. 3:16-17)
 - Compare 3 words with 5:29: sorry/comfort, made/work, and grieved/toil
 - (3) The Sovereign's will demonstrated—6:7
 - To judge all living creatures, to prevent violent wickedness from completely destroying mankind
 - ii) The gracious contrast revealed—6:8
 - God expresses His favor toward Noah
- 2) The beginning of the record of Noah—6:9-12 (the 3rd toledoth; going through 9:29)
 - a) God's moral description of Noah specifically—6:9
 - These three traits are the results of grace, not the cause of grace
 - i) Vertical: *just*—conforming to God's standard (cf. Ezekiel 14:14, 20)
 - ii) Horizontal: perfect—blameless among his contemporaries
 - iii) Vertical: walked with God—in harmony with and obedient to God (cf. 5:22, 24)
 - b) Noah's sons—6:10
 - In order of spiritual significance, not birth (cf. 9:24; 10:2)
 - c) God's moral description of living creatures in general—6:11-12
 - i) Corrupted/ruined God's original purpose for them
 - ii) Filled with violence toward God's other creatures
 - iii) All creatures morally accountable to God
